We are proud to be a Reconciling in Christ congregation.

It's that time of year again; time for us to think about our life – what we want to change in the coming year, resolutions we want to make, etc.

I've never been one for resolutions, but I have been thinking a lot about my life lately (probably because I'm about to enter the 4th decade of my life☺). I've been thinking about who I am as a wife, mother, friend, and pastor. I've been thinking about how I can be better about in all these roles. A better wife – how about less bickering and more building up? In the Relationship study of which Steve and I were a part, we were reminded that little, petty issues can blow up into big, ugly issues if not handled quickly and lovingly. We've worked hard on this, through the accountability of our group. A better mom – how about less yelling and scolding and more quality time spent playing games or even just hanging out together? Sometimes it seems like there are just never enough hours in the day to do all the things I want to do. I have gotten better about setting work aside to spend time with the kids – we try to eat dinner together every night that we can; we do game nights together – just goofy times to have fun together. As I type this Pastor's page, I'm looking forward to our annual family trip to Chicago for dinner, a carriage ride, an overnight in the city, and a family movie. We've been doing this since 1994...it's a tradition that I value so much and one that I hope my kids remember as they get older. A better friend – how about remembering to listen and be there for my friends – less "it's all about me" and more "it's all about you"? The give-and-take of a friendship is something I value. Honestly, outside of my church family, I have just a few friends – some in the local Fire and Police Departments and my best friend, June. I value the time we get to spend together and just talk, and laugh, and sometimes even cry together.

A better pastor – this is the one I struggle with the most. I want to be the kind of pastor that empowers others to use their Spirit-given gifts to serve God. CHURCH COUNCIL



Following are highlights from the November 2008 Council Meeting:

Correspondence received:

- Northern Illinois Food Bank – we received a \$1,500 grant for the pantry. \$750 is for the purchase of a freezer; \$750 is put in our account to purchase food. Congratulations to the team for getting the grant.
- Note from the Northern Illinois Synod reporting our giving for 2008. So far, we have given 9.4% of our tithe. The Council agreed by consensus to start giving 5% of our weekly income to the Synod, hoping to raise the amount we are giving.
- Request from Skoff Elementary School to provide tutors for a new tutoring program. Pastor will put out an email and a sign-up sheet to see who is interested.

Preschool Report

- Over \$1,800 was raised through the cookie dough fundraiser. Some of the funds will be used to purchase new, and replacement, items for the preschool.
- Upcoming fundraiser – Jewel Shop and Share – Dec. 15-17. We will receive 5% of the profits on what is sold.
- Pastor has been teaching the kids songs that they will sing in church on December 14. We will have them sing two more times throughout the school year.

Financial Secretary's Report

- 2009 pledges, as of the Council meeting, are 35 pledges for a total of \$118,304. We are hoping to receive several more pledges and will update the Council if any come in.
- Chris reminded us that a monthly income of \$16,122 is needed to meet our budget.
- Total deficit for September and October is \$10,871.49.

Treasurer's Report

- Debbie will be moving \$2,054.58 from the general fund checking account to the Special Collections account – Youth Group. These funds are monies raised by the Youth for their trip to DCLA.
- Debbie will continue to give weekly updates to the Council, providing information on what bills are due and how much money is available in the checking account.

Pastor's Report

- Pastor expressed the need to move away from supervision toward mentoring. She looked over some of Tom Bandy's suggestions and wants to work with the Council to provide accountability for this move.
- Pastor reiterated the need to move away from a "volunteer" mentality in serving to the use of spiritual gifts. Helping people connect with their spiritual gifts and serving should be a priority for 2009.
- Pastor expressed the desire to serve more out of her giftedness, which includes preaching, creativity/artistry, and connecting one-on-one with people. She will work with the Council to find ways to release non-essential duties to others so that she can begin to focus on these areas of her ministry.

Ministry Team Reports

- *Evangelism*
 - We continue to sell crosses through the Disciples' Cross ministry. People are encouraged to buy crosses to share with friends and co-workers.
 - We are working on signage to be put out on Sundays, advertising our services. Chris Daniels and Sandy Beggs are working on this together.

- We are still working on the updated directory and hope to have something out at the beginning of the New Year.

- **Fellowship**

- RENEW suppers have ended for 2008. They will restart after the 1st of the year.

- Little Lambs, a social group for children in preschool-5th grade, has restarted. A kick-off event will be held on Dec. 6. They'll be decorating cookies and planning events for 2009.

- Working on a date for next 'Tweeners event – fondue night at the (Mc)Daniel(s)' house.

- **Learning**

- Lots of opportunities to connect with small groups (see the Learning page in the newsletter for more info).

- Youth Group/YBS (Youth Bible Study) is going well. Lots of youth attending.

- Sunday School – Debbie and Carol Viduna will discuss possible changes to the program, including how often it is offered.

- **Social Ministry**

- We received 24 meals from Jewel through the Turkey Bucks program.

- We collected/received 139 boxes of food from Harvest Saturday food drive.

- The team brainstormed ideas for 2009: serve at a soup kitchen, volunteer at Hospice, watch children at Lamb's Fold, a book give-away, World Hunger, etc.

- **Stewardship**

- The "Giving and Growing – Making It Personal" presentations are going well. Commitment Sunday will be Nov. 23. We are hoping to see an increase in giving – both in the number of pledges and in the amount pledged.

- The team will be working on a second presentation to cover Spiritual Gifts. We hope to begin something in January 2009.

- **Worship**

- The team is working on holiday services including Advent, "In the Name of Love: the Manger."

- The team is also working on a "job description" book to provide information for people serving in various worship ministry areas.

- The team is looking for more volunteers to serve on Sunday morning road crews.

Unfinished Business

- Copier – the new one has been received; we are waiting for the old one to be removed
- Nominating Committee – Debbie is the only member of the Committee so the Council will assist in praying about possible candidates to serve on the incoming Council.
- Budget Committee – the Council will begin working on the 2009 budget and will hopefully have a working budget in place for the December Council meeting.

New Business

- Mission Support (see Correspondence for more info)
- Pastor's Compensation Package 2009 – discussion about how Pastor Suzanne is compensated – what is included; Synod guidelines were discussed. The Council will meet to discuss her package for 2009 and will include it in the 2009 Proposed Budget.
- Ministry Team/Council/Pastoral responsibilities – Lynne Soja presented the importance of clarifying roles and responsibilities for team leaders/members, Council members, and Pastor. There is a concern that too many things continue to fall on Pastor Suzanne, things that Council members and/or team members can be addressing or handling. This will be discussed at the December Ministry Night in more detail.
- Annual Congregational Meeting – January 25, 2009 – We will hold one service that day at 9:15 a.m., with the meeting to follow. Reports from teams and Council Liaisons are due on January 11.

Next Council meeting will be Dec. 23 at 7 p.m.

the church, etc. I want to connect with our gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender brothers and sisters who are longing to find a place of welcome in God's family. I want to connect with the drug addicts, the alcoholics, the abusers of pornography who are using the wrong things to fill the void in their lives. I want to connect with the mothers and fathers who are at their wits' ends, trying to balance work and family responsibilities. I want to know that every person in Romeoville knows that God loves them and wants them to be a part of His family.

I believe we all have a personal mission; something that makes our heart burst, as Tom Bandy described it. Maybe, as you are looking to a New Year, you should pray about what your personal mission is. What is it that makes your heart burst? To whom do you find yourself drawn – wanting to reach out in powerful ways; willing to sacrifice for them?

It's easy to resolve to lose weight, or quit smoking, or any number of other vices. It's harder to resolve to commit your life to the service of God. The story of Jesus' mother, Mary, is an example of this willingness to serve. *“I am the Lord's servant, and I am willing to accept whatever he wants (Luke 1:38).”*

Wouldn't it be great to have that kind of attitude when it comes to serving God? The Psalmist writes, *“Commit everything you do to the LORD. 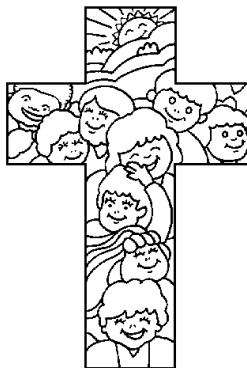

Interested in Making a Difference in a Very Special Way?

Volunteers are needed and welcome to join a newly-introduced program at Good Shepherd Church. We will be offering support to hospice families through direct and indirect contact. This is an effort that requires very little time, but yields the biggest benefits to the families.

We are looking for volunteers to start in January. Please take a look at the following list of volunteer opportunities.

Direct Care: (Adults)

Respite Care: Actually sit with hospice patients (in hospice home, nursing home, or their home)
Companion for families in hospice: Visit with family and hospice patient
Bereavement Calls: Follow up with family after the loss of a loved one

Indirect Care: (Adults)

Clerical/office volunteer
Greeter at Hospice home
Marketing Volunteer
Sew bibs for hospice patients
Sew memory bears ***Real need for this
Gardening at the hospice home
Bake cookies to be distributed to hospice patients and their families. (This can be done as often as once a month or as little as once a year.)

Teens / Children

Free-will offering concert/talent show with proceeds going to help pediatric hospice
Make cards or pictures for patients (holidays, seasons)
Make Christmas ornaments (possibly adults too, family project??)
Plant seeds to grow flowers (the children learn about God's love through creation & the flowers brighten someone's day also)

Families

Holiday food baskets (about 8- 10)
Easter baskets for children (pediatric hospice patients or children of hospice patients)
Christmas gifts for the neediest hospice families (Avg. 35-40)



To be a hospice volunteer, people need to attend a training session that is offered twice a year. It consists of 8 hours of training on 2 consecutive Saturdays. The next offering of this class is in April 2009. Registration begins in January. The class goes in-depth about the hospice beliefs. I am told that people come out of it with a complete compassion about the care that enables dying people and their families to live peacefully with dignity to the last moment of the patient's life. No classes are needed for anyone baking cookies (and probably sewing the bears but I have to check that for sure). That would allow someone who is unable to take the class to still help.

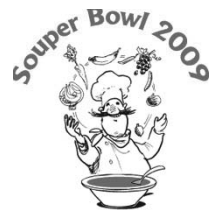

Stewardship - Sharing our Time, Talents & Treasures ...

Our mission is *“to bring glory to God by spiritually connecting, preparing, and encouraging His children to serve Christ through the sharing of their gifts.”*

The Giver

Remember: Your Spiritual Gifts are God’s special gifts given specifically to you. What you do with these gifts becomes your special gifts to Him.

This month’s highlighted Spiritual Gift is **The Giver**. The person that has **The Giver** as one of their dominant Spiritual Gifts serves God by giving of his or her material resources, far beyond the tithe, to further the work of God. **The Giver** is the person who meets the financial needs of fellow Christians and church ministries. **The Giver** honestly feels that the best way they can serve is to give of their material gain to build up the Church. They feel that God has given them the ability to make money and that they should use it to give back to God and His work. They understand that the Bible directs everyone to tithe, and are motivated to give far beyond their tithes. They are able to use their gift often as there is never a shortage of areas where they can “pitch in.” They usually give without much, if any, fanfare and prefer that others don’t know who they are or how much they are giving. Their motive for giving is to further the work of God and not to be a “show off.” They find true joy in using their gift to help others. **The Giver** is usually well organized, quite often keeps to his or herself and never wants their giving publicized. They tend to have an accurate self-image, are lighthearted and are particularly interested in helping other people in the name of God.

How might those of you with the gift of **The Giver** make use of your gift in support of the ministries at Good Shepherd? Social Ministry contributions are always needed and welcome. God leads

you to provide for those in need of food, or clothing or housing and any time that there is an appeal for individuals or families that are in immediate need. Giving to our Preschool is a great way to see your gift at work and at the same time, possibly make a lifelong difference in a young person’s life. There will never be a shortage of ways for you to put your spiritual gift to use. In every church, there is always a need for people with your gift.

While many of those who completed their Spiritual Gifts Assessment scored relatively high for this gift, no one has the gift of **The Giver** as their dominant gift. That certainly goes along with their need to have some degree of anonymity. However, I’m going to go out on a limb here and list those who have high scores for the gift of **The Giver** (and isn’t it interesting that God has chosen so many husband and wife teams?)

2008 Annual Congregational Meeting

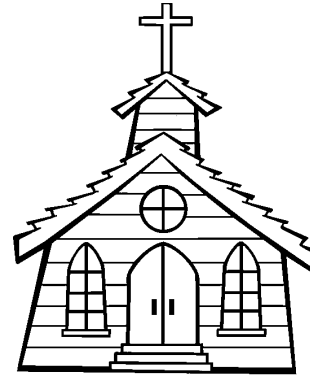
Sunday, January 25

The Annual Meeting of the congregation will take place on Sunday, January 25 at the Romeoville Recreation Center.
