We are proud to be a Reconciling in Christ congregation.

This month we focus heavily on our spiritual journeys as we enter the week of Holy Week. I know that we have a lot of new people in our church and many of you are new to the Christian journey. So, I thought I'd take some time to outline what this Holy Week is all about – why we celebrate it, what each day means, etc. I hope you'll find this helpful to your journey.

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday, or the Sunday of the Passion. This is a day when we remember Jesus' triumphal entry into the city of Jerusalem. According to the Gospels, Jesus entered on a donkey. This shocked many, as few expected their "king" to ride on a donkey, an animal not looked upon very highly.



The week continues with Maundy Thursday. On this night, we recall the Last Supper and Jesus' final hours with the disciples before his arrest.

We read Jesus' words of teaching, encouragement and challenge to the disciples as recorded in the Gospels. We gather, as the disciples did, around the table to receive Communion together, recalling Jesus' words, "Do this in remembrance of me." We leave the worship place in silence on this night, as we prepare for the darkness of Good Friday.

On Good Friday, we remember Jesus' walk to the cross, his crucifixion, and his sacrifice for our sins. This is a somber day and the services reflect this in their tone and color (black cloth is often used to cover the cross). Again, we leave the worship space in silence as we think about how the sacrifice affects our own spiritual journeys.



Following Good Friday, we enter Holy Saturday, or the day of the Easter Vigil. This service has historical roots. It was a time for the church to gather and remember the passage from the darkness of Good Friday into the bright morning light of Easter. We also take time to read the stories of our ancestors and God's promises to them; we remember our baptisms through a service of renewal; and we gather at the altar to receive the first communion of Easter.

Highlights from February 2009 Council Meeting:

Correspondence received: Pastor Suzanne received a letter from Bishop Wollersheim congratulating her on being honored as Citizen of the Year; letter from Robert Hayes regarding cemetery plots for sale

Preschool report

- Staff salaries were discussed and a motion was made to include a 3% raise and keep bonus incentives for 2009-2010 contracts.
- Sweetheart Dance went very well; \$300 was raised from ticket sales and raffles.
- We had a surprise visit/inspection from DCFS. There are a few minor things we need to take care of before our representative comes back.

Treasurer's Report

- Debbie will be looking into our Mission Investment Fund investments to determine what we need to do to access the interest from the accounts.
- Debbie will continue to update the Council weekly on bills due and income received.

Pastor's Report

- Pastor Suzanne sent a copy of the ad for the Pastoral Assistant position to East Conference churches, asking them to share it with those looking for work. If she doesn't hear anything within a few weeks, she will send the ad to other local churches.
- Pat Hurdle and Pastor are working on updating our records, including the removal of deceased, transferred, or inactive members. These names will be brought to Council on a monthly basis. Names date back to the origin of the congregation, in the early 1960s.
- Upcoming retreats/conferences she'll be attending: April 2-4, Spiritual Retreat; April 24-25, Confirmation Retreat; May 3-6, HRC Clergy Conference; Willow Creek Arts Conference, June 9-12; Synod Assembly, June 19-20; DCLA, July 9-13; ELCA Assembly, August 17-22.

- **Church records** – Motion “to accept the list of names to be removed from active membership of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, as presented by Pastor Suzanne.” Approved

New Business

- **Church Membership Program** – Pastor Suzanne will present a possible computer program for organizing and maintaining our church membership records at our March Council meeting.
- **Offering envelopes** – A question was raised as to why the expense for the envelopes falls under Stewardship. The Council decided that, for 2009, the expense would come out of the Stewardship budget. Also, a suggestion was made from the Stewardship Team that the envelopes be distributed by the Financial Secretary. The Council agreed this would be done starting in 2010.

Holy Week culminates, of course, on Easter – the day when we celebrate Jesus' victory over death. Easter lilies, like trumpets, herald the risen King! Songs of joy and praise are sung as we look with hope at the Risen Lord!

I have found in my own spiritual walk, that in order to fully appreciate the joy of Easter, I must walk all the days of Holy Week. While it is sometimes hard to read and remember the abuse Jesus took on my behalf, remembering it helps me be grateful for the sacrifice He made. Being a part of all of the services during Holy Week moves me closer to Christ...a little bit closer every year.

If you are new to the Christian journey, I encourage you to engage in these worship experiences. I truly believe they will draw you closer to Jesus. If you are not-so-new to the Christian journey, I challenge you to make these services a priority in your spiritual walk. Sometimes, the longer we've been Christians, the farther we are from Him because we begin to take things for granted. This year, I pray that you will draw closer to Jesus and take time to remember the amazing gift of love God has given for us and to us in Jesus Christ.

****This year we will offer a special opportunity for adults and youth in grades 7 and higher, to join us for a showing of the movie, “The Passion of the Christ.” This is a very moving, and graphic, portrayal of the final moments of Jesus' life. Most people who have seen the movie find it to be an incredible experience that reminds them of Jesus' sacrifice for them and helps them to fully appreciate the gift we have been given in Him. The movie will be shown on Wednesday, April 8 at 7 p.m. The location is to be determined. If you are interested in attending, please sign up at church. We'll gather at 6:45 p.m. and begin the movie promptly at 7:00 p.m. It runs just over two hours.****

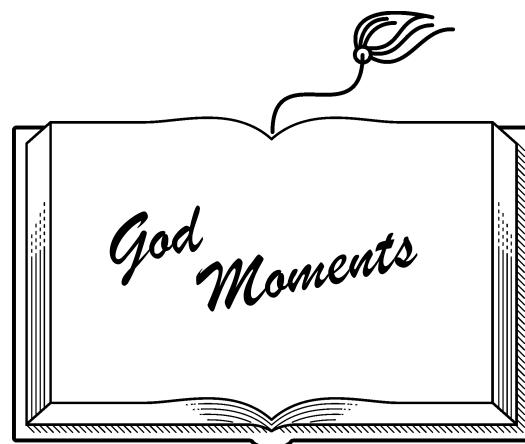

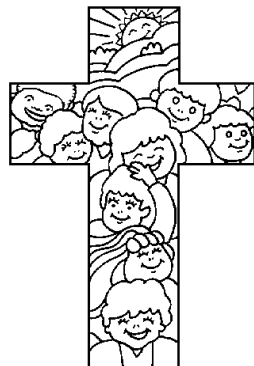

Traditions

Ah ... smell that? Spring is definitely in the air.

Traditionally a time when start looking forward to things like longer and warmer days and early Spring flowers busting through and brightening up

our mostly brown and grey yards. We look forward to traditions like the NCAA basketball tournament we lovingly refer to as “March Madness” and the beginning of “America’s favorite pastime,” opening day of Major League Baseball.

Traditions. They’re everywhere. You have your family traditions. Your school and work traditions. You have things that are traditionally good as well as some that are traditionally bad. Our military services are “steeped in tradition,” whatever that is. It’s said that the only body or organization that has more tradition than the military services is the Church.

The way I look at traditions – If it happens once, it’s an event and if it happens twice, it just became a tradition. Well, it appears as though what started out last year as an ‘event’ is now destined to become a tradition, at least here at Good Shepherd.

Back in April of 2008, your Stewardship team presented this “Blessed to Be a Blessing” invitation/challenge to our congregation: “Today, we are praying that you will consider the place that money has in your lives and, as a way of experiencing the joy, the peace and the freedom of offering a tithe, you would take advantage of this bold offer. It’s our hope that, as a way of understanding the feelings that accompany giving a tithe, you will consider the



enclosed one time, no questions asked, money-back offer. In the 2008 Economic Stimulus Rebate, God has blessed us with an unexpected gift. It is the hope of the Stewardship Team, and the Church Council, that you will prayerfully consider giving a tithe of this rebate (10%) to Good Shepherd Church.”

We also offered that you could “choose which ministry ... you would like to bless with your tithe.” The program was well received and 16 individuals/families took advantage of the opportunity to test the tithe “waters” with the insurance that it would be backed by a one time, no questions asked, money-back offer. No one asked for their money back and I suspect that some are among the ranks of our new annual tithe givers.

We have been asked by a number of members if we thought that we would make the same offer this year as they wanted to “try it” once more or for the first time. ... Trumpets Please!

ANNOUNCING THE BIRTH OF A NEW TRADITION!

We are making the same offer, only this year, it is for a tithe of your 2008 Income Tax Refund. Some offered that they wouldn’t be receiving a federal refund but would like to offer a tithe of their state tax refund. Of course, the same offer applies.

How do you take advantage of this opportunity? If you haven’t already received a “Blessed to Be a Blessing” package, they can be found on the take home table. If you’re having trouble finding them, talk to a Council member or a member of your stewardship team.

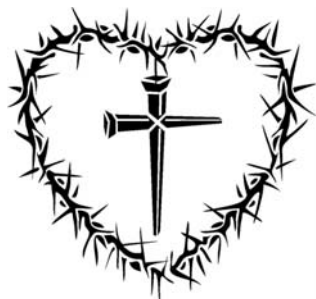

Summer Midweek Services

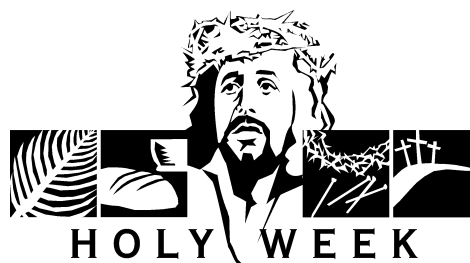
Monthly midweek services will be held the first Tuesday of each month during the summer. The services will be held at 7 p.m. at the church on June 2, July 7, and August 4.
